This term we welcome back Emily Bremner and Kellie Mannering who have both been on leave. Ms Bella Burgess-Wilson is taking leave this term and will be replaced by Mr Chris Littlejohn who has been filling in for Ms Bremner last term.

## Professional Learning

On Monday staff took part in a number of sessions to build our skills and understandings across the school. Amy Robinson led an information session about the Hobart Human Library, an exciting opportunity for our Grade 8 students that will be taking place here at school on Thursday. Students will be hearing from a range of people who will share information about themselves with the aim of building student's understandings about other people as well as developing their empathy skills. Staff also worked together to plan our Science Week event that will be happening during the week beginning August 15<sup>th</sup>. More information about this will be sent home soon.

Teachers spent time working on plans for Term 3 and this was an opportunity to share skills and ideas which will be followed up with a Planning and Assessment day in the next few weeks during which teachers will work in teams to further develop their plans for the remainder of the term.

A large part of the day was spent learning about Autism and developing our understandings and knowledge about strategies to assist students who have autism. Developing our skills in areas such as this ensures that we are providing positive outcomes for all our students and we will be undertaking more Professional Learning in this area later in the year.

As we are currently in the process of updating our Mobile Phone Policy staff also spent time reviewing the current policy and identifying issues surrounding mobile phone use in classrooms. This information, together with information we are receiving from parents will form the basis of our new policy which we are hoping to have finalised before the end of this year. On the last week of Term 2 we held our annual NAIDOC Week Assembly. We heard from Mrs Rawlings and Mr Crawford about their experiences of teaching and living in remote areas of the Northern Territory and Western Australia. Students shared a range of work that they have been doing in classes. We also learnt about traditional games played in remote communities and as the photos show there were some great efforts by staff and students!



Grade 2/3 and Grade 5/6 recently visited Snug School and learnt about traditional bush foods and other aspects of Aboriginal life and they shared this information with everyone. Grade 4/5 have researched key aboriginal people in Tasmania and showed us some interesting facts about them.

The choir entertained us with some great singing and Grade 8 students shared some information about NAIDOC Week and why it is important in Australia.

## School Uniform

We would like to remind families about our School uniform Policy and have included the dress code here as a reminder about our expectations. A full copy of the Policy is available at the school office. Teachers and senior staff are spending considerable time following up on non-uniform items each day and this has a flow on effect for all. We would really appreciate your support in making sure our students are in uniform each day. As it is colder we do not mind students adding extra layers but these must not be visible. ie adding an extra t-shirt under the uniform.

### Dress Code

#### Jewellery

Rings, bracelets, ear-rings, necklaces etc are not to be worn to school because of the danger they create for the wearer during physical education, sport and general play, and the risk of loss for which the school cannot accept responsibility. Students with pierced ears may wear sleepers or studs.

#### Footwear

Footwear must be safe; in particular, thongs and open toed shoes are not acceptable at school due to the risk of injury.

#### Be Safe and Sun Smart

We are a SunSmart School and in accordance with this policy all primary students are required to wear a wide brimmed hat when they are outside and to seek shade areas as a precaution against the effects of our summer sun. Secondary students should wear a hat and sunscreen or seek shaded areas. The compulsory hat period coincides with daylight savings. Staff will direct students to shade areas if they don't wear a hat at these times.
